Angel Ring Update

20th March 2005

Angel Ring Project gathers momentum.

With 65 Angel Rings installed to date, ANSA NSW is finally on target to finally achieve its aim of installing and managing 100 life saving devices along the NSW coast at known rockfishing blackspots.

National Parks has approved another three rings within the Munmorah State Recreational Area on the Central Coast of NSW, these will complement the 2 rings that were installed there in December last year. Another ring is in the process of being approved at Garie Beach, in the Royal National Park, this will complement the ring at Wattamolla, and with the recent installation at Crampton Is, within the Meroo National Park near Ulladulla the NPWS and all its rangers must be congratulated for all the hard work they have done behind the scenes to get these proven life savers in place.

Discussions with the Department of Lands have generated positive news, with verbal approval given for 3 installations within the Warringah local government area and a blanket letter of approval from the Department allowing ANSA NSW to install the rings on crown land and reserves. Proposals will then be submitted for the Pittwater area and discussions have already commenced with regional offices in the Hunter for 2 rings on the Swansea Breakwall.

ANSA NSW is calling for nominations from community groups or individuals to nominate sites that they think will benefit anglers, bushwalkers or the general public who may be at risk when accessing the rock platforms up and down our vast coastline.
