# NSW Angel Ring Update

## More Rings for NSW

More rings are scheduled for 2012 with 15 new locations being submitted for approval between Cape Byron and Yamba. Seven of the locations will be on river breakwalls at locations at Brunswick Head, Evans Head, Iluka and Yamba and the other locations are at Evans Head, Broken Head and Cape Byron.

Approvals are being sought for the breakwall at Lake Illawarra, 6 new locations in Sydney between Waverly and Dover Heights and 5 locations at Tuross on the states south coast. It is going to be a busy few months for the team.

## More Rescues

On the 26<sup>th</sup> of February a surf ski rider was rescued after having his ski smashed in two on the breakwall at Ballina. Anglers on the wall threw the angel ring to the man in the water in very rough conditions and he managed to get back to shore. Neil Adams who is the local contact and caretaker of the rings in the area arrived at the same time as the rescue services and retrieved the ring and set it back out on the breakwall. This was the 3<sup>rd</sup> person rescued by the rings on the Ballina breakwall and the 48<sup>th</sup> confirmed rescue in NSW

## More Signs

The Angel Ring Project completed a roll out of signs in the Warringah Council area on Sydney's northern beaches at the request of the Council. 11 signs were positioned on access tracks and funnel points that lead to popular rock fishing spots between Dee Why and Manly.
