More Rings and Rescues

The most recent rescue of rock fishing anglers at Fraser Park highlighted the fact that wearing a lifejacket will save your life if you do find yourself in the water. Two anglers were plucked from the water on the Central Coast of NSW, one wearing a lifejacket and one in an angel ring who had a broken collarbone. The total number of confirmed rescues with the angel rings has now reached 31, but what is even more rewarding is that the message of wearing a lifejacket is being taken up by anglers who fish the rocks.

Also four new angel ring assemblies were recently installed near Kioloa, just south of Ulladulla bringing the total number of rings across NSW to 91. Snapper Point received 3 of the rings and 1 was installed at O'Hara Headland. It was a very sombre moment for the angel ring team as one of the Snapper Point locations was at the very spot a young angler lost his life almost 18 months ago. His mother and family were on hand to watch the installations.
