## ANSA NSW DRIVES AN INCREASE IN ROCK FISHING EDUCATION CAMPAIGN

ANSA NSW in conjunction with the Recreational Fishing Alliance of NSW, The Recreational Fishing Trust Fund, NSW Department of Primary Industries, NSW Department of Sport and Recreation and with new partner Warringah Council has embarked on an intensified recreational angler awareness campaign to target non-English speaking rock fishing anglers. ANSA NSW and the Recreational Fishing Alliance has been distributing translated safety advice in the form of brochures and a rockfishing safety DVD for many years, with close to 150,000 free DVDs in circulation. Both organisations have participated in workshops with Korean, Chinese and Vietnamese rock fishing anglers.

Over the past few weeks ANSA NSW has also been working closely with Warringah Council to increase awareness in the local area. Council has received translated DVDs and brochures to distribute within the area and on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> July, Council representatives helped ANSA NSW install more translated rock safety signage on the rock platforms at Harbord, Dee Why and Curl Curl.
